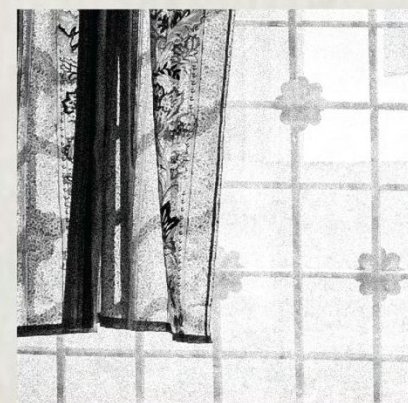
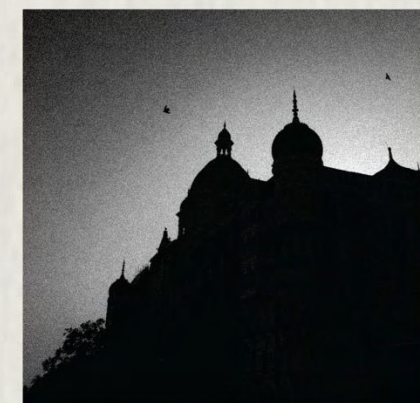
Mark 10:35-37 ^{NIV}

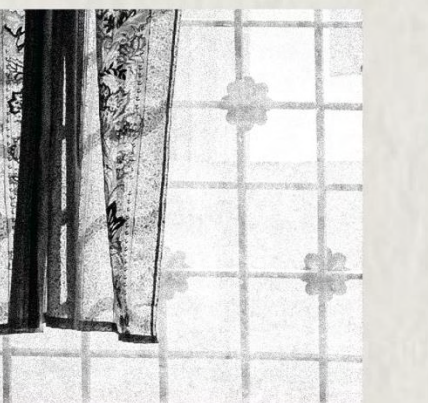
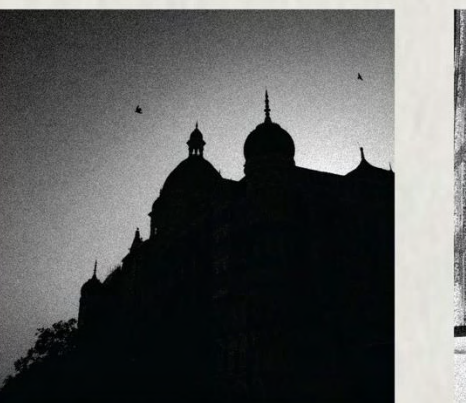


Mark 10:42-45 ^{NIV}

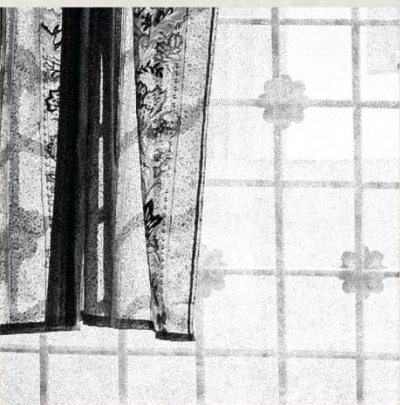

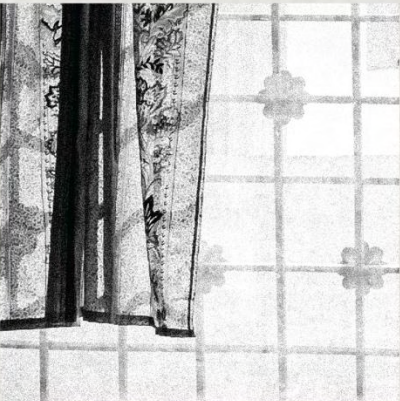
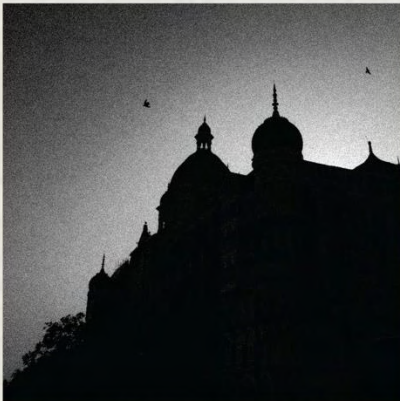
